- 2.) **December 12: Non-Profit Management:** Learn the challenges and opportunities of running a non-profit from local and state non-profit leaders and consultants and how to get involved.
- 3.) **January 9: 8:30AM – 3:30 PM: Leading the Project- Successful Development in the Five Stages – Presented by Dennis T Martino, Adjunct Professor, Granite State College**
